

# ARRA DOE WAP Funding Plan

Weatherization Assistance Funding Distribution for the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) to be proposed at the April 14, 2009 Public Hearing. This is the 33rd funding year for this unique Congressionally funded assistance program designed to assist income eligible households to reduce costs of heating and cooling. Only non-profit organizations and units of general purpose local government are eligible to be Subgrantees of the Arizona Department of Commerce. In addition, heavy preference is given to those entities historically operating this program which are implementing it in a satisfactory manner. The primary purpose of the Public Hearing to be held April 14, 2009 is to provide an opportunity for organizations and individual members of the public to comment upon the continued local sponsorship of the Weatherization Program by the below named "Subgrantees."

The Public Hearing scheduled for April 14, 2009 is designed to meet the funding requirements of the United States Department of Energy. Unlisted at this time are other sources of funds which may become available to the listed Subgrantees. It is not known at this time what amounts the other funds will be for the period April 1, 2009 - March 31, 2012 nor which funding sources may become available. Other funds are typically available and thus the overall operational size of the DOE funded Subgrantees provides for a much larger scale of program implementation than would otherwise be possible with DOE funds alone.
